

Jelly Roll Lane is named for the fact that 40  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips sewn end to end measure 1600 inches and make one long lane! This little jelly roll jolly is going to be your go-to quilt when you need a quick gift for that someone special! Since jelly rolls are already coordinated you can mix and match this throw quilt as often as you change the décor in your home!

#### SUPPLIES NEEDED:

1 Jelly Roll or a total of 40  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " coordinated strips

Border Fabric (if desired)

3" Border-  $\frac{7}{8}$  yard

4" Border-  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yards

5" Border-  $1\frac{5}{8}$  yards

Binding Fabric

$\frac{2}{3}$  yards

# JELLY ROLL LANE QUILT 50X64



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## Cutting



\* width of fabric

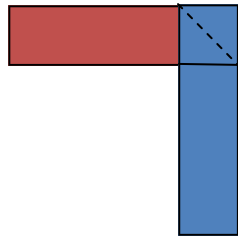
\*\* all seams are  $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise noted

If you do not already have a Jelly Roll, then you will need to cut 40\* coordinating  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

## Piecing

Begin by unrolling your Jelly Roll and randomly selecting strips to sew together. Try to be as random in your selection as possible to get the most unique look to your Jelly Roll Lane Quilt.

Diagonally piece strips end to end. Lay two strips right sides together and sew on the diagonal as shown. Do this for all 40 strips, so that you have one long (1600") lane.



Your strip should look something like the one below.



Once you have the strip completed, trim all of the seams to  $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press to one side.

**Next you will trim off 18" off one side of your strip.**

**Do not skip this step as it is necessary for the staggered effect.**

Begin sewing the strip together by bringing the two ends right sides together and sewing down the long seam.

When you get close to the end, pause sewing and cut the strip in half, then complete the seam.

Do this process a total of five times, each time bringing the end of the strip set to the top and sewing right sides together and trimming when you get to the end.



Your quilt top is complete when it measures approximately 50x64". Add a border to complete the top! Quilt and bind as desired! Enjoy!

Bring this end to the top, and place right sides together, sewing the seam along the right hand side.
